SKYLAR STORM WARNING INFORMATION

March 12, 2018

Dear Millville Residents:

Please know Millville Officials continue to monitor weather reports along with updates from the Massachusetts Emergency Management Association as we prepare for yet another Nor'easter! The National Weather Service has issued our region a WINTER STORM WARNING from 11PM Tonight to 8PM Tuesday Evening. The following is what to expect for our Town and area.

- * **WHAT:** Heavy snow with total snow accumulations of 12 to 16 inches, with localized amounts up to 19 inches.
- * **WHERE:** Portions of central, eastern and southeastern Massachusetts, and Rhode Island.
- * **WHEN:** From 11 PM this evening to 8 PM Tuesday evening.
- * **ADDITIONAL DETAILS:** Near blizzard conditions possible. Travel will be very difficult. 1 to 3 inch per hour snowfall rates are possible at times along with blowing and drift snow during the Tuesday morning commute. The Tuesday afternoon commute is also expected to be impacted. Be prepared for significant reductions in visibility at times. Tree branches could fall due to strong winds.

This is being categorized as a **MAJOR** Storm Event, with anticipated power and telephone outages that will likely affect our residents over an extended period. Our local public safety officials are planning in advance to keep our community as safe as possible throughout the severe weather.

The Town Hall, Senior Center & Library will be **CLOSED** Tuesday during regular day & evening hours.

However, the Senior Center will again open as a WARMING SHELTER for any residents who lose power during the storm. Tuesday morning, our local MEMA volunteers plan to open at 10AM with coffee and pastry and later offer a lunch of Soup, Sandwiches and Snacks for residents seeking shelter.

Should any person or family have an emergency, require transportation or need immediate assistance during the storm please do not hesitate to contact our

Police Department at (508) 883-3117.

Please stay off the roads and safe in your homes throughout the storm. Remember to bring pets into the safety of your home and do not let them venture outside without a lead because they can become quickly disoriented and lose their way in blizzard conditions!

Electric and telephone companies are mobilizing with rotating shifts and external crews to address outages.
