
BOARD OF SELECTMEN

MINUTES OF MEETING

Board Members Present: Vice Chairman Tom Petrowicz, Charlie Poulin, Jackie Lima and John Laura

Board Members Absent: Chairman Paul Savage

Others Present: Executive Secretary Helen Coffin, Fire Chief Mullaly, Police Chief Landry, Finance Committee Chairman Adam Menard

Being a quorum of members present, Vice Chairman Petrowicz asks for a motion to open a meeting of the Board of Selectmen at 7:04 p.m. at the Uxbridge Police Department.

Motion by Poulin, second by Lima, to open the meeting of the Millville Board of Selectmen for the purpose of discussing regional dispatch. <u>Motion passes by unanimous vote</u>.

The Board meets with town officials of Uxbridge to discuss the possibilities of regionalization of dispatch services.

After introductions of all parties are made, Uxbridge Police Chief Freitas explains that the goal is to provide top notch dispatch services to the Towns of Uxbridge and Millville. Chief Freitas also provides a brief history of the Uxbridge dispatch services.

Uxbridge Police Sergeant Emerick provides an overview of the current Uxbridge dispatch services including specifics of the staffing and facility. He also reviews and discusses statistical data of both towns.

Chief Freitas speaks at length concerning the feasibility of regionalizing dispatch services between the towns. He emphasizes that serious consideration must be given before combining the two centers. He feels that the recent grant received by the Town of Millville should be utilized to determine feasibility of such a regional service. He feels that it would behoove both towns to utilize the feasibility study to get an outside opinion. He explains that Fire Chief Ostroskey is looking into consultants on the state contract list so that a bid process would not be required. He feels the timeline should be aggressive and we should get the study going as soon as possible.

Chief Freitas further provides a brief overview of the grant funding projections. Chief Landry asks for clarification as to whether operating expenses for the Uxbridge station

would be paid from the grant monies. Chief Freitas indicates that it is not his intent to use the funds in such a manner. Chief Landry asks for confirmation from the Uxbridge Board of Selectmen. Uxbridge Selectman Baghdasarian believes Uxbridge would give a competitive price, such a regional agreement would need to make sense for both towns, but it is quite possible that operating expenses would be paid from the grant monies. Lengthy discussion follows among the parties regarding operating costs.

Selectman Petrowicz questions whether the radio frequencies are compatible and feels this would also need to be taken into consideration. Brief discussion follows regarding radio frequencies. Chief Freitas believes that at least one-third of the first year's grant would go towards this equipment.

Chief Freitas indicates that a Committee of the stakeholder communities would be created to determine how the grant funds would be spent.

Uxbridge Chairman Kuros feels that both towns are looking for a win/win. The goals are to save money and maintain services.

Chief Landry would like to know if he could play an active roll in collective bargaining negotiations. He feels that he should be included in anything that affects the costs to Millville. Brief discussion follows concerning negotiations. Matters such as this would need to be reviewed when preparing a regionalization agreement.

The parties are given a tour of the Uxbridge Police Department and dispatch area where they are able to ask questions concerning the equipment and building.

At the conclusion of the tour, the Selectmen assemble with Chief Landry for brief discussion and comment concerning the evening's presentation. Chief Landry reviews the potential grant funding for Uxbridge and funding already received by Millville. The members will give the matter of regionalization thought over the next couple of weeks.

Motion by Poulin, second by Lima, to adjourn the Meeting at 9:00 p.m. <u>Motion passes</u> by unanimous vote.

Chief Freitas,

Please see attached for the projected numbers if Uxbridge takes on Millville. These numbers assume that Uxbridge will dispatch all services for both communities. Please remember these are only projected numbers! Keep in mind that once you're a regional emergency communications center, you are eligible to purchase/maintain radio systems. You may also apply for development grant money which you can apply for this spring for FY2010. That money can be used for equipment and bricks and mortar type needs to build or expand a regional PSAP.
