
TOWN OF MILLVILLE BOARD OF SELECTMEN





6:00 p.m.

Board of Selectmen Members Present: Chairman Paul Savage, Vice Chairman Tom Petrowicz (arrived late) and Members Charlie Poulin, Jackie Lima, and John Laura.

Others Present: Executive Secretary Helen Coffin, Historical Commission Members Margaret Carroll, Janet Davis, Jean Poulin and Jose Lima

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm at the Millville Town Hall.

The Board of Selectmen meets with the Historical Commission to discuss the future of 181 Main Street, a historical mill brick building which is in need of serious repairs.

Janet Davis informs the Board that a landscape assessment was done on this property in 2001 – a copy will be provided to each Board member. This property was also recently identified on the Town's Heritage Landscape Plan.

Jose Lima informs the Board that in his opinion, after a site visit to the building, the building is structurally sound. The masonry is in excellent shape; however, the building does need a new roof.

The Commission feels there are many uses for this building, such as a new dispatch center, police station, recreation facility, extension of town offices. The nearby garage is also in good shape, however, the small shed/nurse's building should come down – it is dangerous.

The roof could be replaced without the need to deal with the asbestos clean up. The Commission feels this would be a rehabilitation project vs. a restoration project although they would encourage maintaining the aesthetics of the building while keeping it functional.

The Commission was not able to determine the status of the plumbing and electrical systems but it is assumed that all would need to be replaced due to code requirements. Some windows are still in tact.

The Commission would like to look into grants to have the roof replaced so as to keep the building weather tight over the next few years. This will enable them the opportunity to look into the building and property possibilities much further.

Selectman Savage supports the cause, however, does not want to see the building still sitting there in the same state ten years from now. He feels it is best to figure out how to jump start the replacement of the roof.

Margaret Carroll provides a brief history of the property, reading an excerpt from information written in October of 2001. Margaret informs the Board that the Town will also need to work with the P&W Railroad. A description of various properties along the river is provided.

{Selectman Petrowicz arrives}

Margaret Carroll believes the Historical Commission needs to continue its research so that it can provide recommendations to the Board of Selectmen. For instance, it needs to establish whether the property can be accessed and whether the plaque should be moved.

Would the Board of Selectmen like the Historical Commission to continue with the research and provide regular reports to the Board? Would the Board like anything investigated first?

The Commission would like to have someone from the Boston Historical Commission come out to recommend possible funding sources for such a rehabilitation project.

With the Board's approval, Margaret advises that the Commission will begin an outline of how to proceed to develop the property and parallel the use of the building.

The Board of Selectmen fully support this endeavor.

John Dean comments on the involvement of the railroad and the possibility of looking into a walk-through crossing.

The Board takes a 5-minute recess before convening its Regular 7:00 Board Meeting.



Town Planner, Joe Laydon:

The Town Planner, Joe Laydon, along with representatives from the John H. Chafee Blackstone River Valley spoke to the Selectmen about the Blackstone River Bikeway. This project will be a total of 48 miles with 28.5 miles in Massachusetts and 19.5 miles in Rhode Island. A project timeline was provided. By the summer of 2009, 25% of design of the bikeway will be submitted for environmental and historic resources permitting. The next bikeway taskforce meeting will be on Tuesday, January 27, 2009. The local involvement from Millville will include right-of-way, funding, maintenance, support, and communication.

Joe Laydon requests that the Board of Selectmen to sign two letters which will be sent to Mass Highway and DCR to come together and solve these open-ended issues.
