



- On a motion made by Ken Gikas, and seconded by Paul Savage, the Board of Selectmen voted <u>unanimously</u> to appoint Chris Kalnicki as a Part-time patrolman and dispatcher through June 30, 2007.

CORRESPONDENCE:

- There is a Central Massachusetts Regional Planning Commission meeting being held on Wednesday August 16, 2006 at 4:30 in Worcester.
- The Board of Selectmen has sent a letter to Senator Moore showing support for the feasibility study on railroad service.
- The town will receive a STRAP Grant of \$227,850.00 for the Lincoln St. project.
- The requirements for the new postal service have been outlined. They will be trying to find a new facility. This project has not received fully funded.
- A letter from the Blackstone Valley Heritage Commission indicated that 25% of the design plan for the bikeway is completed. They will be changing the review of plan by adding a split rail fence.
- A letter was received from Governor Romney releasing 55 million dollars in Chapter 90 monies. The town will get an additional \$26,000+/-.

GOOD AND WELFARE:

John Dean work on the sidewalk. The sidewalk repair is only a temporary repair. John was trying to get the federal government to pay, but they denied that. John is recommending that the town possibly use the strap grant.

Selectmen Dicks informed the residents of Millville that he has purchased a piece of property in another town. When the business deal is final he will then submit an official resignation to the town.

Selectmen Gikas informed residents that he has bought property in another town and will let the Board of Selectmen know when it is official and will resign from his position.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT:

Special Town Meeting:

The Special Town Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, August 22, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. The final drafts are available and require signatures from the Board of Selectmen signatures. On a motion made by Brian Dicks, and seconded by Ken Gikas, the Board of Selectmen voted unanimously to accept the warrant.

Strap Grant Contract:

On a motion made by Paul Savage, and seconded by Brian Dicks, the Board of Selectmen voted unanimously to authorize the Chairperson to sign the contract with MASS Highway for the Lincoln St. project.

Collective bargaining for the labor agreement:

The Board of Selectmen will sign agreement.

Handicap Ramp Bid:

On a motion made by Brian Dicks, and seconded by Paul Savage, the Board of Selectmen voted unanimously to authorize the Chairperson to sign the contract for the handicap ramp.

The work will begin the week of August 28, 2006. It will be completed by September 8, 2006. Helen will coordinate with the police in regards to the access in and out.

Crack sealing Bid:

On a motion made by Paul Savage, and seconded by Ken Gikas, the Board of Selectmen voted unanimously to authorize the Chairperson to sign the contract for the creak sealing.

Town Hall Exhaust Fan:

The town hall fan has been fixed.

Town Hall Downspouts:

The three downspouts on the town hall were repaired.

Legal Request:

On a motion made by Paul Savage, and seconded by Ken Gikas, and seconded by Brian Dicks, the Board of Selectmen voted <u>unanimously</u> to authorize the Planning Board to seek legal advice.

Library Permit Waiver Fee:

On a motion made by Brian Dicks, and seconded by Paul Savage, the Board of Selectmen voted <u>unanimously</u> to authorize a waiver of building permit fee for the town library.

Community Opportunity Group:

On a motion made by Brian Dicks, and seconded by Ken Gikas, the Board of Selectmen voted <u>unanimously</u> to authorize the Chairperson to sign the new agreement relating to in-kind work at the new Senior Center.

Senior Center director:

On a motion made by Brian Dicks, and seconded by Ken Gikas, the Board of Selectmen voted <u>unanimously</u> to authorize the Chairperson to sign the application for the Council on Aging formula grant.

Air Conditioning System:

The executive secretary received a quote of \$5,000 to provide a ductless air conditioning system for the Board of Selectmen room. The Board of Selectmen are in agreement that this estimate is too much. The executive secretary will look into getting just a new air conditioner for upstairs.

Town Planner:

The new Town Planner is coming up with some good ideas and the Board of Selectmen would like him to come to one of the meetings.

Charter Complaint:

The Board of Selectmen received an email from a resident complaining about charter communications. This resident does not understand why the town cannot use another company. The Board of Selectmen explained that the town is under a ten-year contract with Charter. Any resident that has a complaint should contact the executive secretary and also provide a written reason so we could address it with Charter.

Resignation:

On a motion made by Paul Savage, and seconded by Brian Dicks, the Board of Selectmen voted <u>unanimously</u> to accept the resignation from Erin Chicoine as a part-time dispatcher.

OLD BUSINESS:

• Snow Plowing Contract:

Mr. Lafontaine will be taking over the contract for Mr. Lemay. The board has received excellent references. The Board of Selectmen met with John Dean and he would like the snowplow drivers to use the time cards. This will be monitored by John Dean. If is John is not available Helen will make copies of the time cards and handle the billing.

• Police Chief Hiring Process:

The advertising for the new police chief is being advertised. The applications are due back September 15, 2006.

• Police Department Assessments:

The police department is in the process of being assessed. This is being completed by a professional organization that will make specific recommendations to the town once completed. The assessment team will be compiling information from a variety of sources.

• Landfill:

The company, BATG, that was hired to cap landfill has encroached into the wetlands. There will be a joint meeting with the Conservation Commission, Tata & Howard, and BATG to assess and determine what steps to take. The meeting will be Wednesday. August 9, 2006.

NEW BUSINESS:

• Kopelman & Paige:

Jay Talerman, the lead attorney from Kopelman & Paige, has recently left the firm. Our new lead counsel recently appointed is Lauren Goldberg. The Board of Selectmen wants to research other firms.

• Quaker Street:

The Board of Selectmen wants the sidewalk issue resolved by Carriage Estates II.

• Tree Warden:

The Board of Selectmen would like to set up a meeting with the tree warden to determine if more support is needed.
