

Mike Pare informed the Board that he had researched several motion detectors ranging in price from \$175.00 - \$199.00. These devices would mount to the door and would only require a 9 volt battery since they are wireless.

Chief Ryan spoke and informed the Board that this same issue was addressed last year and the reason why buses can't go down this particular cul-de-sac street is that it adds time to the bus routes.

# John Dean:

- 1. mentioned that the bus stops are a continuing problem with more new developments being built:
- wanted to inform the Board that the mail for the housing authority is piling up. Diane mentioned that the mail should be opened to make sure there is not any important correspondence;
- 3. informed the Board that his workers are 95% finished doing the cutting and trimming on the streets. The cemetery is also complete.
- 4. shared information about the guardrail that is requested by the Blackstone Valley National Heritage Corridor.

# Chief Ryan wanted to address several issues:

- 1. Shared the new pre-emption devices. He currently has five.
- 2. The Grafton Barracks will be determining the criteria when an AMBER ALERT is called.
- The students at the Vocational Technical School will look at the bodywork on the cruiser.

  They will determine how long the work will take to complete.
- 4. Chief Ryan informed the Board that he will be getting the Bullet Proof Vests for no cost to the town. There is another grant to offset the remainder of the cost.
- Badge America has completed the last batch of ID's.
- 6. All the cruisers are paid for.
- 7. Chief Ryan recently hired a part-time dispatcher. She will begin training for 911 soon.
- 8. A new patrolman will be starting after the background check and physical are complete.
- 9. There will be a MASS on Emergency Management on Sunday, September 14th at 8:00 a.m.
- 10. The Jimmy Fund Walk is tentatively scheduled for the third Friday in September.

  Mike Pare wanted to commend Chief Ryan on his hard work.
